1 Introduction

The goal for this L^AT_EX package is to provide an easy way to use the Traffic Light Protocol (TLP)[1] in your documents.

2 Usage

To use the package, simply add it with `\usepackage[label]{tlp}` to set the TLP level (explained in next section), then simply add the `\tlp` command wherever the TLP level should be shown like this: **TLP:CLEAR**.

To comply with FIRST, you MUST use the `\tlp` command in your header and footer. It SHOULD be set in at least **12pt** font size. It is recommended to right-justify TLP labels.

This document uses MUST and SHOULD as defined by RFC-2119[2].

3 Labels

The following labels are defined and therefore can be used with this package. For easier use, both all-uppecase as well as all-lowercase has been implemented, however the output will always be all-uppecase as defined by FIRST [1].

Import	Output
<code>\usepackage[red]{tlp}</code>	TLP:RED
<code>\usepackage[amber+strict]{tlp}</code>	TLP:AMBER+STRICT
<code>\usepackage[amber]{tlp}</code>	TLP:AMBER
<code>\usepackage[green]{tlp}</code>	TLP:GREEN
<code>\usepackage[clear]{tlp}</code>	TLP:CLEAR
