To use the package, simply add it with \usepackage[label]{tlp} to set the TLP level (explained in next section), then simply add the \tlp command wherever the TLP level should be shown like this: TLP:CLEAR.

To comply with FIRST, you MUST use the \tlp command in your header and footer. It SHOULD be set in at least **12pt** font size. It is recommended to right-justify TLP labels.

This document uses MUST and SHOULD as defined by RFC-2119[2].

3 Labels

The following labels are defined and therefore can be used with this package. For easier use, both all-uppecase as well as all-lowercase has been implemented, however the output will always be all-uppercase as defined by FIRST [1].

Import	Output
\usepackage[red]{tlp}	TLP:RED
\usepackage[amber+strict]{tlp}	TLP:AMBER+STRICT
\usepackage[amber]{tlp}	TLP:AMBER
\usepackage[green]{tlp}	TLP:GREEN
\usepackage[clear]{tlp}	TLP:CLEAR
